Management Discussion of Fund Performance

Results of Operations

Fidelity American Opportunities Fund ("Fund"), Series B, returned -3.7% for the six-month period ended December 31, 2011, after fees and expenses. The net returns of the other series of this Fund are similar to those of Series B, except for differences attributable to expense structures. By way of comparison, the S&P 500 Index, broadly representative of the U.S. equities market, returned 1.6% (in Canadian dollar terms). The Fund underperformed the broad-based benchmark due to exposure to mid-cap growth and cyclical stocks which, in an uncertain economic climate, underperformed the broader market.

The Fund's specific benchmark, the Russell 1000 Growth Index, returned 1.4%, in Canadian dollar terms, for the six-month period under review. The Fund's underperformance is primarily attributable to security selection in and an underweight exposure to the information technology sector. At the end of the review period, the Fund had an exposure of about 27.1% to the information technology sector, compared with benchmark exposure of 28.0%.

U.S. equities, as measured by the S&P 500 Index, gained 1.6% (in Canadian dollar terms) during the period under review, led by encouraging economic data. The European debt crisis and its implications for the global economic recovery had an impact on stock market returns. More recently, however, European leaders outlined steps to refinance peripheral debt and announced increased involvement by the IMF. Better-than-expected economic growth and corporate earnings calmed fears of a recession in the U.S. However, markets remained volatile amid growing uncertainty over the future of the euro, the ability of the U.S. to resolve its fiscal deficit situation and China's ability to withstand global economic headwinds.

During the review period, portfolio managers Stephen Balter and Christopher Galizio decreased the Fund's exposure to the information technology sector from an overweight position to an underweight, concentrating the portfolio in names about which they hold the highest conviction. They are focusing on companies that have broad industry exposure and that will benefit from improving economic conditions. The Fund remains overweight in the financials sector, which benefited from increased pricing power and decreased competition in the wake of the financial crisis. The portfolio managers continue to favour companies that can benefit from rising short-term interest rates. The Fund's exposure to select names in the energy sector was also increased, on the belief that these stocks will benefit from a cyclical recovery. The managers increased the Fund's exposure to the consumer staples sector during the review period. The Fund continued to have no exposure to either the utilities or the telecommunication services sectors; from an investment standpoint, companies in these sectors traditionally offer less growth potential.

Recent Developments

Portfolio managers Stephen Balter and Christopher Galizio continue to expect a slower-than-optimal growth environment plagued by a lagging employment recovery. With the recent market pullback, the managers are now seeing credible value in the market, especially among cyclical stocks that have been beaten down in recent months. Accordingly, they are positioning the portfolio to capture an upward revaluation of severely depressed asset values. As always, they continue to seek investment opportunities where future free cash-flow growth is underappreciated by the market.

As at December 31, 2011, the Fund had its largest overweight exposure to the financials sector, while the consumer discretionary sector accounted for the largest underweight, relative to the benchmark. In terms of the Fund's absolute exposure, the information technology sector accounted for the largest exposure, followed by the consumer staples sector.

Accounting Standards

Changeover to International Financial Reporting Standards

The Canadian Accounting Standards Board (AcSB) of the Canadian Institute of Chartered Accountants (CICA) had planned to adopt International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS), as published by the International Accounting Standards Board, effective January 1, 2011. Subsequently, the AcSB deferred the adoption of IFRS for investment companies, which include investment funds. Investment companies may continue to apply existing GAAP standards until fiscal years beginning on or after January 1, 2014.

The manager is reviewing and developing a plan to meet the above timetable for changeover to IFRS. The impact of IFRS on accounting policies and implementation decisions will mainly be in the areas of presentations and disclosures in the financial statements of the Fund. Currently, two significant areas that may impact the presentation are IAS 32 Financial Instruments: Presentation, and IAS 27 Consolidated

and Separate Financial Statements. The manager is currently assessing the Fund's unit-holder structure and investments to determine the impact of these standards. The manager has currently not identified any changes that will impact net asset value per unit (NAVPU) as a result of the changeover to IFRS. However, this present determination is subject to change resulting from the issuance of new standards or new interpretations of existing standards.

Related Party Transactions

Manager and Portfolio Adviser

The Fund is managed by Fidelity Investments Canada ULC (Fidelity). Fidelity is a wholly-owned subsidiary of FMR LLC. FMR LLC is the parent company of a group of subsidiaries collectively known as Fidelity Investments.

Fidelity provides or arranges for the provision of all general management and administrative services required by the Fund in its day-to-day operations, bookkeeping, record-keeping and other administrative services for the Fund.

Pyramis Global Advisors, LLC (Pyramis), an affiliate of Fidelity, provides investment advice to the Fund. Pyramis provides investment advice with respect to the Fund's investment portfolio and arranges for the acquisition and disposition of portfolio investments, including all necessary brokerage arrangements.

The Fund pays Fidelity and Pyramis a monthly management and advisory fee for their services, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. The Fund paid Fidelity and Pyramis management and advisory fees of \$127,000 for the period ended December 31, 2011.

Administration Fee

Fidelity charges the Fund a fixed administration fee in place of certain variable expenses. Fidelity, in turn, pays all of the operating expenses of the Fund, other than certain specified fund costs (e.g. the fees and expenses of the Independent Review Committee, taxes, brokerage commissions and interest charges). The Fund pays an annual rate, which is calculated on a tiered basis, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. The Fund paid Fidelity administration fees of \$21,000 for the period ended December 31, 2011.

Brokerage Commissions

The Fund may place a portion of its portfolio transactions with brokerage firms which are affiliates of Fidelity, including National Financial Services LLC, provided it determines that these affiliates' trade execution abilities and costs are comparable to those of non-affiliated, qualified brokerage firms, on an execution-only basis. Commissions paid to brokerage firms that are affiliates of Fidelity were \$0 for the period ended December 31, 2011. Fidelity receives standing instructions from the IRC in respect of policies and procedures governing best execution, which includes brokers affiliated to Fidelity, at least once per year.

Management and Advisory Fees

Fidelity serves as manager of the Fund and Pyramis serves as the investment advisor of the Fund. The Fund pays Fidelity and Pyramis a monthly management and advisory fee for their services, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. Fidelity uses these management fees to pay for sales and trailing commissions to registered dealers on the distribution of the Fund units, as well as for the general investment management and administrative expenses.

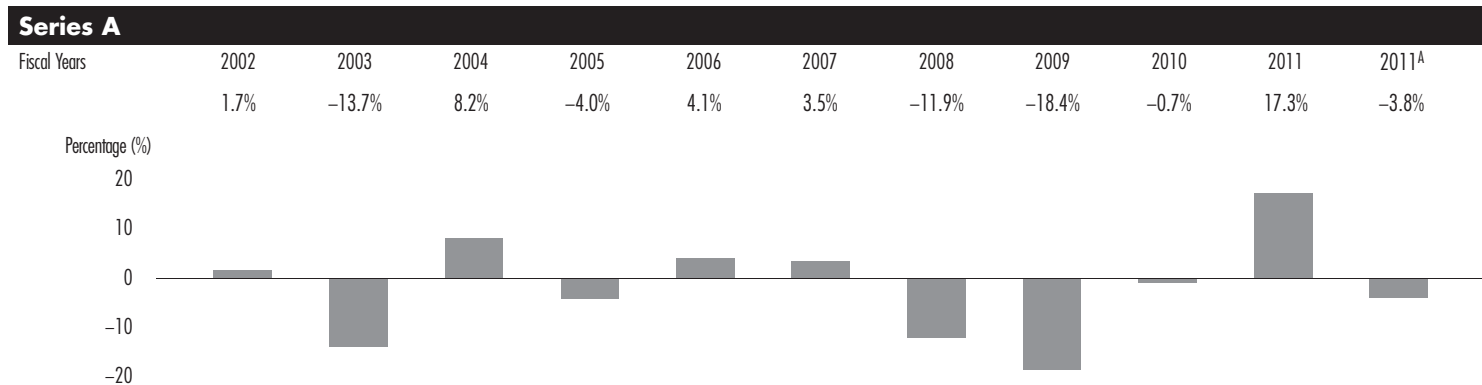
Past Performance

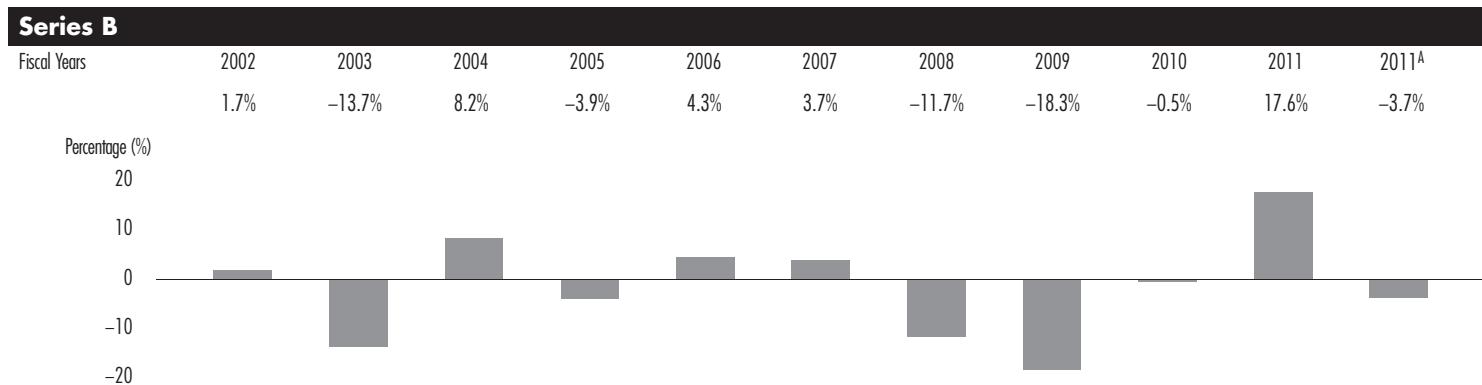

Year-by-Year Returns

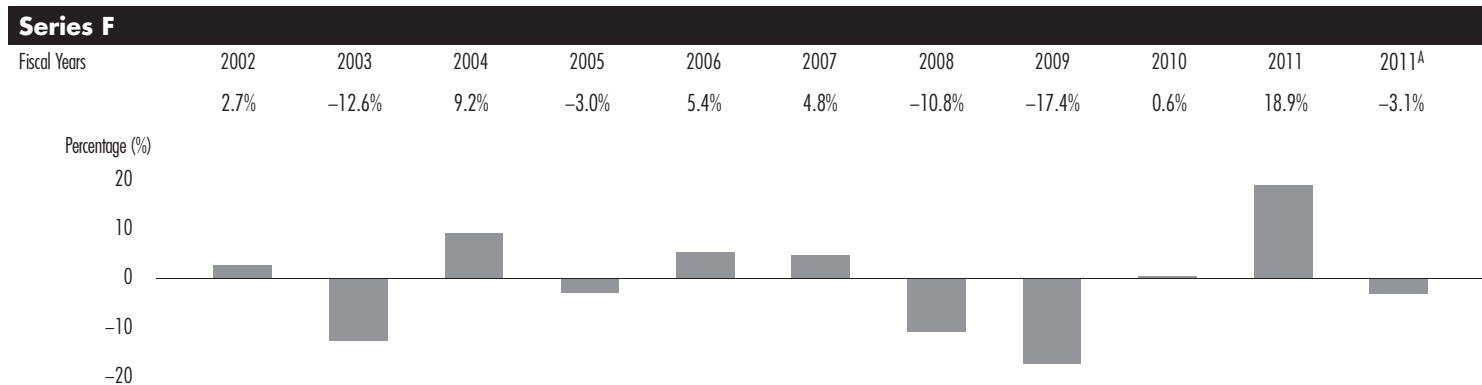
