## Management Discussion of Fund Performance

### Results of Operations

Fidelity Canadian Balanced Fund ("Fund"), Series B, returned -2.2%, after fees and expenses, for the six-month period ended December 31, 2011. The net returns of the other series of the Fund are similar to those of Series B, except for differences attributable to expense structures. By way of comparison, the S&P/TSX Composite Index, broadly representative of Canadian equities, returned -8.9%. The Fund has a targeted mix of both equity securities and fixed-income securities. The Fund's fixed-income securities outperformed the equity markets in general, after concerns about a slowing global economy and the European debt crisis prompted investors to shun riskier assets.

The Fund's specific benchmark, the Canadian Balanced Blend, returned -1.1%, in Canadian dollar terms. The Fund's holdings in equity securities added value during the six-month period, while holdings in investment-grade bonds detracted from performance. At the end of the review period, the Fund had an exposure of 44.1% to equities, compared with the 50% benchmark weighting.

The Fund's blended benchmark consists of 50% S&P/TSX Capped Composite Index, 40% DEX Universe Bond Index and 10% BofA Merrill Lynch US High Yield Master II Constrained Index.

The Canadian stock market declined during the review period, amid uncertainty caused by the European debt crisis and concerns about China's outlook for economic growth. However, Canada's economic momentum remained robust in the latter part of 2011, with Canada's GDP growing in the third quarter at an annualized rate of 3.5%. A surge in exports helped to calm growing concern that the country was facing significantly slower growth or recessionary conditions. Among credit sectors, Canadian and U.S. government yields remained low, while sovereign yields of select eurozone economies such as Italy rose sharply, due to the ongoing debt crisis.

During the period under review, the Fund engaged in forward contracts, in a manner consistent with its investment objective and strategies, to hedge as completely as possible against the effect of currency fluctuations on the Fund's foreign-currency denominated fixed income. The use of forward contracts in this manner does not completely eliminate the impact of currency fluctuations on returns. The Fund's returns will differ from the local currency returns of the Fund's underlying investments.

For the period under review, the U.S. dollar appreciated by about 6.0% against the Canadian dollar. Losses on the Fund's positions in forward contracts detracted from relative returns.

The Fund's equity portfolio manager has been positioning the portfolio defensively. Despite strong fundamentals in many sectors, ongoing economic risk factors are creating investor uncertainty. In Europe, investors continue to await clarity on potential remedial efforts by European governments to resolve the debt crisis. Meanwhile, in China, economic growth has continued to decelerate. Accordingly, the equity portfolio manager is positioning the fund defensively, focusing on quality businesses with high dividend yields, as well as companies with stable free-cash flows that can grow in a recessionary environment. The equity portfolio manager reduced exposure to the materials sector, particularly to the more economically sensitive metals and mining and chemicals industries, due to concerns about demand, given a slowing global economy. In contrast, the manager increased exposure to the gold industry, given increasing uncertainty in global markets. Among financials stocks, the manager maintained a significantly underweight position, particularly in banks, expecting slower loan growth and net interest margin pressure due to increased competition and low interest rates. Exposure to the energy sector, particularly the oil and gas storage and transport industry, was increased, with a focus on large-cap companies.

Among investment-grade bonds, the fixed-income portfolio managers continued to maintain a large exposure to corporate fixed-income securities; they are optimistic about the investment opportunities in this area created by the current market conditions. Among corporate bonds, the largest absolute exposure was to financial issuers, especially Canadian banks.

Among U.S. higher-yielding fixed-income securities, the portfolio manager continued to take a balanced approach, positioning the portfolio defensively. He believes that fundamentals remain favourable, with good new issuance flow and liquidity.

### Recent Developments

The portfolio co-lead managers seek to maintain the asset allocation in line with the Fund's blended benchmark. Mr. Friebel and Ms. Egan believe that the market will continue to experience volatility due to the uncertainty in the global economic outlook given the ongoing sovereign debt crisis and slowdown in China.

The equity portfolio manager continues to position the Fund defensively in light of ongoing economic uncertainty, including sovereign debt issues in Europe and the prospect of an economic slowdown in China. Against this volatile backdrop, the manager maintains a fundamental

approach to selecting and evaluating companies on a stock-by-stock basis. Over the short term, he expects equity markets will remain volatile. Although he expects an interim solution for the European Union, the manager does not believe it will be a permanent solution.

In fixed income, the portfolio is highly liquid in order to be well positioned to take advantage of buying opportunities that current levels of spread volatility may provide. The portfolio managers are optimistic about the investment opportunities created by current market conditions, especially in the corporate and securitization sectors.

The U.S. high-yield portfolio manager remains patient, believing that it is not necessary to take excessive risk to achieve a solid return. The asset class remains attractive from a total return perspective. Rather than looking at sectors, the manager has been focusing on a name-by-name basis.

An investor became a holder of more than 10% of the outstanding units of the Fund in the period ending December 31, 2011.

### **Accounting Standards**

#### *Changeover to International Financial Reporting Standards*

The Canadian Accounting Standards Board (AcSB) of the Canadian Institute of Chartered Accountants (CICA) had planned to adopt International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS), as published by the International Accounting Standards Board, effective January 1, 2011. Subsequently, the AcSB deferred the adoption of IFRS for investment companies, which include investment funds. Investment companies may continue to apply existing GAAP standards until fiscal years beginning on or after January 1, 2014.

The manager is reviewing and developing a plan to meet the above timetable for changeover to IFRS. The impact of IFRS on accounting policies and implementation decisions will mainly be in the areas of presentations and disclosures in the financial statements of the Fund. Currently, two significant areas that may impact the presentation are IAS 32 Financial Instruments: Presentation, and IAS 27 Consolidated and Separate Financial Statements. The manager is currently assessing the Fund's unitholder structure and investments to determine the impact of these standards. The manager has currently not identified any changes that will impact net asset value per unit (NAVPU) as a result of the changeover to IFRS. However, this present determination is subject to change resulting from the issuance of new standards or new interpretations of existing standards.

## **Related Party Transactions**

### **Manager and Portfolio Adviser**

The Fund is managed by Fidelity Investments Canada ULC (Fidelity). Fidelity is a wholly-owned subsidiary of FMR LLC. FMR LLC is the parent company of a group of subsidiaries collectively known as Fidelity Investments.

Fidelity provides or arranges for the provision of all general management and administrative services required by the Fund in its day-to-day operations, bookkeeping, record-keeping and other administrative services for the Fund.

Pyramis Global Advisors, LLC (Pyramis), an affiliate of Fidelity, provides investment advice to the Fund. Pyramis has entered into sub-advisory agreements with Fidelity Investments Money Management Inc., FMR Co., Inc. and Pyramis Canada ULC; affiliates of Fidelity, to provide investment advice with respect to all or a portion of the investments of the Fund. Pyramis provides investment advice with respect to the Fund's investment portfolio and arranges for the acquisition and disposition of portfolio investments, including all necessary brokerage arrangements.

The Fund pays Fidelity and Pyramis a monthly management and advisory fee for their services, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. The Fund paid Fidelity and Pyramis management and advisory fees of \$36,896,000 for the period ended December 31, 2011.

### **Administration Fee**

Fidelity charges the Fund a fixed administration fee in place of certain variable expenses. Fidelity, in turn, pays all of the operating expenses of the Fund, other than certain specified fund costs (e.g. the fees and expenses of the Independent Review Committee, taxes, brokerage commissions and interest charges). The Fund pays an annual rate, which is calculated on a tiered basis, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. The Fund paid Fidelity administration fees of \$4,577,000 for the period ended December 31, 2011.

### **Brokerage Commissions**

The Fund may place a portion of its portfolio transactions with brokerage firms which are affiliates of Fidelity, including National Financial Services LLC, provided it determines that these affiliates' trade execution abilities and costs are comparable to those of non-affiliated, qualified brokerage firms, on an execution-only basis. Commissions paid to brokerage firms that are affiliates of Fidelity were less than \$500 for the period ended December 31, 2011. Fidelity receives standing instructions from the IRC in respect of policies and procedures governing best execution, which includes brokers affiliated to Fidelity, at least once per year.

The Fund pays Fidelity and Pyramis a monthly management and advisory fee for their services, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. Fidelity uses these management fees to pay for sales and trailing commissions to registered dealers on the distribution of the Fund units, as well as for the general investment management and administrative expenses.

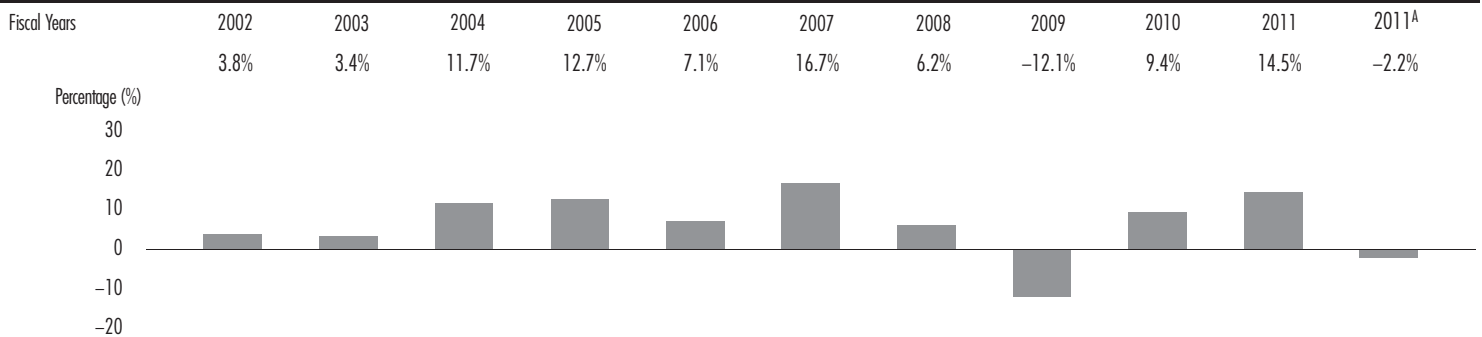

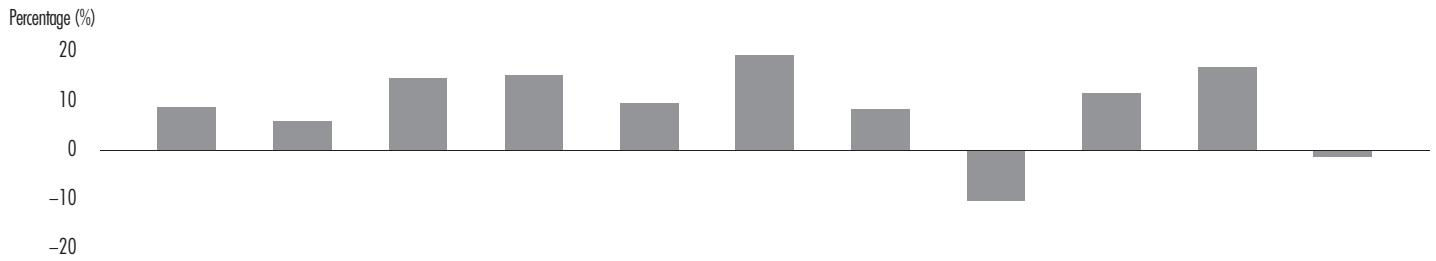

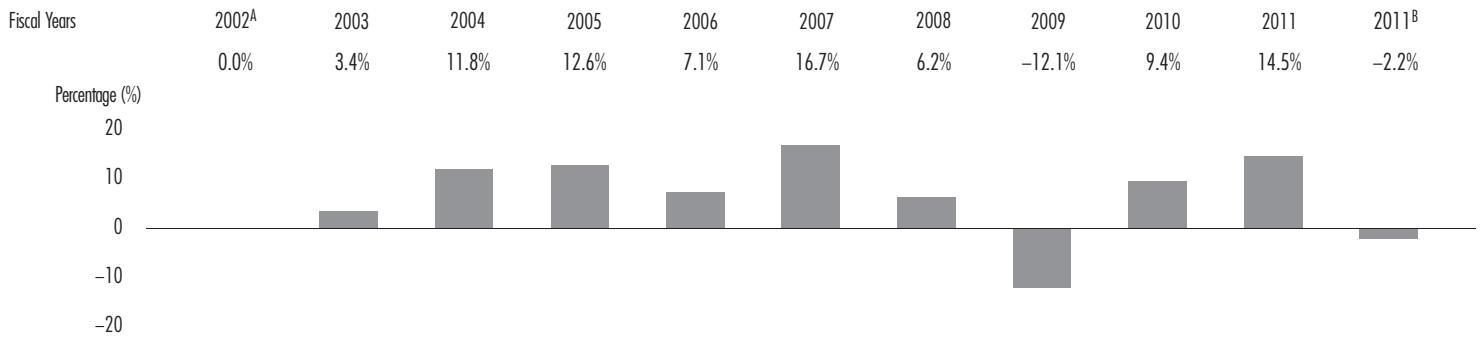
