Management Discussion of Fund Performance

Results of Operations

Fidelity Far East Fund ("Fund"), Series B, returned -15.0%, after fees and expenses for the six-month period ended September 30, 2011. The net returns of the other series of this Fund are similar to those of Series B, except for differences attributable to expense structures. By way of comparison, the MSCI World Index, broadly representative of global equities, returned -10.3% (in Canadian dollar terms). High inflation in Asia, particularly in China and India, and consequent monetary policy tightening, raised concerns about the region's economic growth. This led investors to become more risk-averse, resulting in underperformance of emerging market equities, relative to equities in other regions.

The Fund's specific benchmark, the MSCI AC (All Country) Far East ex Japan Index, returned -14.8% for the six-month period under review. The Fund's slight underperformance of the specific benchmark was primarily attributable to stock selection in Hong Kong and Taiwan. The Fund ended the period with exposures of 25.3% to Hong Kong and 11.9% to Taiwan, compared with the benchmark exposures of 17.9% and 17.5%, respectively.

Stock markets across the region ended the review period posting negative returns, after investors became risk-averse due to increasing uncertainty about the prospects for a resolution to the sovereign debt crisis in Europe and the weak outlook for global economic growth. Economic growth in the region also showed signs of moderation, after the tightening of monetary policies to control inflation. Gold, oil and other commodity prices declined, after surging at the beginning of the review period.

During the six-month review period ended September 30, 2011, portfolio manager Joseph Tse increased exposure to the telecommunication services sector, adding to select positions that continue to benefit from their high subscriber base. The Fund's exposure to the consumer staples sector was increased, due to the defensive nature of the sector. The Fund's exposure to the energy sector was increased by adding select Thai oil companies, due to attractive valuations and a strong refining cycle. In addition, Mr. Tse added exposure to a Thai coal mining company during the period, on the expectation that Chinese demand for coal is likely to remain very strong. Mr. Tse maintained the Fund's overweight exposure to the financials sector, particularly select banks in China and Hong Kong, believing they are well-positioned to benefit from the renminbi liberalization and the growth of the banking sector. He also added exposure to select life insurance companies that have solid capital positions and strong operating performance. Technology stocks constitute a majority of the portfolio's top bets. Given the low but rapidly growing penetration of the Internet and increasing usage of online social media, the manager maintains an overweight stance in Internet businesses. Following strong gains in the consumer discretionary space, Mr. Tse took some profits by exiting an electrical appliances retailer. Positions in select retailers were trimmed, given high valuations and a rise in wage costs that could compress their margins. Mr. Tse also reduced the Fund's exposure to the industrials sector, as he is finding attractive opportunities elsewhere.

The Fund's country positioning is the product of the manager's stock selection process.

Recent Developments

According to Joseph Tse, the recent market correction is not entirely unexpected. To a certain extent, the revival of global markets over the past two years following the global financial crisis and the implementation of quantitative easing programs did not have much substance, and was just a deferral of painful adjustments. In the longer run, Mr. Tse continues to expect a polarized world in which growth will be driven by developing markets such as Asia and China, while developed countries such as the U.S. and Europe will remain sluggish. In terms of valuations, stocks are trading at inexpensive levels around the world, and Asia is no exception. In order to safeguard the portfolios, Mr. Tse has taken some measures over the past quarter to lower the portfolio's volatility: he has added exposure to larger-cap companies trading at reasonable valuations, and reduced exposure to smaller-cap companies that are priced expensively.

At the end of the review period, the Fund had its largest overweight exposure, relative to the benchmark, to the financials sector. The sector also accounted for the Fund's largest absolute exposure, with about 36% of the Fund's assets. The industrials sector ended the period accounting for the largest underweight exposure.

Accounting Standards

Changeover to International Financial Reporting Standards

The Canadian Accounting Standards Board (AcSB) of the Canadian Institute of Chartered Accountants (CICA) had planned to adopt International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS), as published by the International Accounting Standards Board, effective January 1, 2011. In January 2011, the AcSB deferred the adoption of IFRS for investment companies, which include investment funds. Investment companies may continue to apply existing GAAP standards until fiscal years beginning on or after January 1, 2013.

The manager is reviewing and developing a plan to meet the above timetable for changeover to IFRS. The impact of IFRS on accounting policies and implementation decisions will mainly be in the areas of presentations and disclosures in the financial statements of the Fund. Currently, two significant areas that may impact the presentation are IAS 32 Financial Instruments: Presentation, and IAS 27 Consolidated and Separate Financial Statements. The manager is currently assessing the Fund's unitholder structure and investments to determine the impact of these standards. The manager has currently not identified any changes that will impact net asset value per unit (NAVPU) as a result of the changeover to IFRS. However, this present determination is subject to change resulting from the issuance of new standards or new interpretations of existing standards.

Related Party Transactions

Manager and Portfolio Adviser

The Fund is managed by Fidelity Investments Canada ULC (Fidelity). Fidelity is a wholly-owned subsidiary of FMR LLC. FMR LLC is the parent company of a group of subsidiaries collectively known as Fidelity Investments.

Fidelity provides or arranges for the provision of all general management and administrative services required by the Fund in its day-to-day operations, bookkeeping, record-keeping and other administrative services for the Fund.

Pyramis Global Advisors, LLC (Pyramis), an affiliate of Fidelity, provides investment advice to the Fund. Pyramis has entered into a sub-advisory agreement with FIL Limited; a joint actor of FMR LLC, to provide investment advice with respect to all or a portion of the investments of the Fund. Pyramis provides investment advice with respect to the Fund's investment portfolio and arranges for the acquisition and disposition of portfolio investments, including all necessary brokerage arrangements.

The Fund pays Fidelity and Pyramis a monthly management and advisory fee for their services, based on the average net assets of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. The Fund paid Fidelity and Pyramis management and advisory fees of \$4,275,000 for the period ended September 30, 2011.

Administration Fee

Fidelity charges the Fund a fixed administration fee in place of certain variable expenses. Fidelity, in turn, pays all of the operating expenses of the Fund, other than certain specified fund costs (e.g. the fees and expenses of the Independent Review Committee, taxes, brokerage commissions and interest charges). The Fund pays an annual rate, which is calculated on a tiered basis, based on the average net assets of each Series. The Fund paid Fidelity administration fees of \$847,000 for the period ended September 30, 2011.

Brokerage Commissions

The Fund may place a portion of its portfolio transactions with brokerage firms which are affiliates of Fidelity, including National Financial Services LLC, provided it determines that these affiliates' trade execution abilities and costs are comparable to those of non-affiliated, qualified brokerage firms, on an execution-only basis. Commissions paid to brokerage firms that are affiliates of Fidelity were less than \$500 for the period ended September 30, 2011. Fidelity receives standing instructions from the IRC in respect of policies and procedures governing best execution, which includes brokers affiliated to Fidelity, at least once per year.

Past Performance

The performance information shown assumes that all distributions made by the investment fund in the periods shown were reinvested in additional securities of the investment fund. 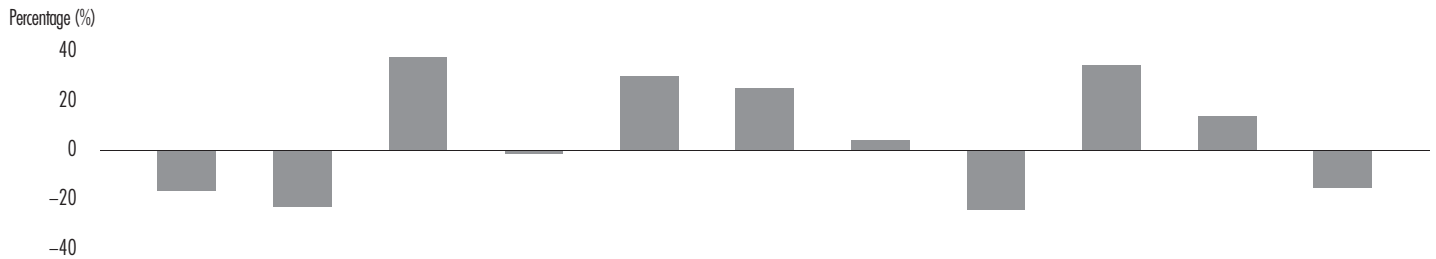
Year-by-Year Returns

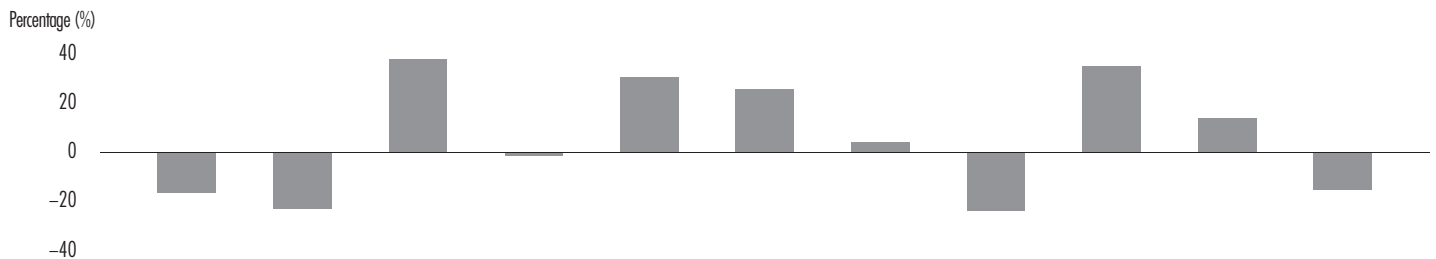

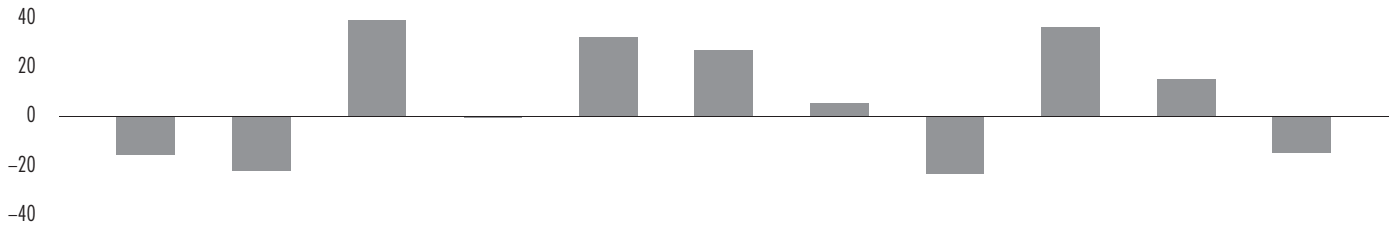

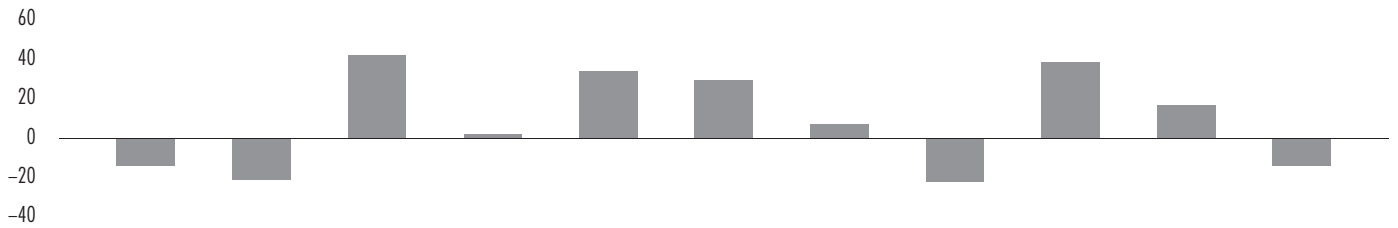
