Management Discussion of Fund Performance

Results of Operations

Fidelity Income Replacement™ 2021 Portfolio ("Fund"), Series B, returned -0.9% for the six-month period ended December 31, 2011, after fees and expenses. The net returns of the other series of this Fund are similar to those of Series B, except for differences attributable to expense structures. By way of comparison, the S&P/TSX Composite Index, broadly representative of the Canadian equity market, returned -8.9% for the period under review. The Fund's outperformance of the broad-based index was primarily attributable to the Fund's exposure to fixed-income and short-term money market securities, in line with its mandate, which outperformed equities amid ongoing concerns about global economic growth and the European debt crisis.

The Fund's blended benchmark returned -0.3% for the six-month review period. Before fees, expenses and hedging activities, the Fund outperformed its blended benchmark. However, after fees and expenses, the Fund underperformed the specific benchmark. Security selection in Canadian equities contributed to the relative returns. At the end of the period under review, the Fund had an exposure of 35.1% to Canadian equities, which was in line with the benchmark weighting.

At its launch, the Fund's specific benchmark was a blended index made up of 20.7% S&P/TSX Capped Composite Index, 4.1% S&P/TSX Completion Index, 3.3% S&P/TSX Capped Income Trust Index, 11.6% MSCI Canada Value Capped Index, 5.6% MSCI ACWI (All Country World) Index, 14.5% DEX Universe Bond Index, 8.4% DEX Short Term Bond Index, 8.4% DEX 91-Day T-Bill Index, 19.4% Barclays Capital Global Aggregate Bond Index – Hedged CAD and 4.0% BofA Merrill Lynch US High Yield Master II Constrained Index – Hedged CAD.

At the end of the period, the blended index was made up of 17.6% S&P/TSX Capped Composite Index, 3.5% S&P/TSX Completion Index, 14.1% Dividend Plus Blend Index, 3.9% MSCI ACWI (All Country World) Index, 14.3% DEX Universe Bond Index, 11.1% DEX Short Term Bond Index, 11.1% DEX 91-Day T-Bill Index, 21.5% Barclays Capital Global Aggregate Bond Index – Hedged CAD and 2.9% BofA Merrill Lynch US High Yield Master II Constrained Index – Hedged CAD.

The Dividend Plus Blend Index combines an 80.0% allocation to a blend of four S&P/TSX industry groups (telecommunication services, utilities, oil and gas storage and transportation, and REITs) and a 20.0% allocation to the S&P BMI U.S. REIT Index – Hedged CAD.

The Canadian stock market declined during the review period, amid uncertainty caused by the European debt crisis and concerns about China's outlook for economic growth. However, Canada's economic momentum remained robust in the latter part of 2011, with Canada's GDP growing in the third quarter at an annualized rate of 3.5%. A surge in exports helped to calm growing concern that the country was facing significantly slower growth or recessionary conditions. The Bank of Canada continued to maintain its key interest rate at 1.0% during the period, to boost economic growth. Yields on Canadian government bonds declined during the period, leading to a rise in the price of government bonds.

During the period under review, some of the Underlying Funds, in which the Fund invests in, engaged in forward contracts, in a manner consistent with its investment objective and strategies, to hedge as completely as possible against the effect of currency fluctuations on the Fund's investment returns. The use of forward contracts in this manner does not completely eliminate the impact of currency fluctuations on returns. The Fund's returns will differ from the local currency returns of the Fund's underlying investments.

During the period under review, the U.S. dollar appreciated by about 6.0% against the Canadian dollar. The Underlying Funds' position in forward contracts, primarily related to U.S. high yield securities, had a minimal impact on the Fund's returns.

At the beginning of the period under review, the Fund's asset allocation was 36.2% Canadian equity funds, 4.1% global equity funds, 14.1% Canadian fixed-income funds, 21.2% global fixed-income funds, 3.0% U.S. high-yield funds and 21.4% short-term investment funds.

At the end of the period under review, the Fund's asset allocation was 35.1% Canadian equity funds, 3.9% global equity funds, 14.3% Canadian fixed-income funds, 21.6% global fixed-income funds, 2.9% U.S. high-yield funds and 22.2% short-term investment funds.

Fidelity Income Replacement™ Portfolios are managed using a proprietary asset allocation model to guide and determine the most efficient transformation of the Fund from its current allocation toward a more conservative target asset mix over the investment period. The portfolio managers monitor total Fund exposures and risks on a daily basis to ensure that the Fund remains near to its prescribed allocation at all times.

Recent Developments

Portfolio co-managers Mark Friebel and Mariana Egan continue to monitor and adjust the Fund's asset mix to meet its changing and more conservative target allocations over time. The proprietary long-term asset allocation strategy is frequently reviewed to potentially improve its process. The purpose of this review is to ensure that the Fund's asset mix is optimized to meet its fundamental investment objective and to confirm that the Fund's targeted risk and return characteristics remain consistent. The portfolio managers invest in underlying Fidelity Funds that invest primarily in a mix of equity and fixed-income securities. During the period under review, Canadian equity funds accounted for the largest share of the Fund's assets, followed by global fixed-income funds.

An investor became a holder of more than 10% of the outstanding units of the Fund in the period ending December 31, 2011.

Accounting Standards

Changeover to International Financial Reporting Standards

The Canadian Accounting Standards Board (AcSB) of the Canadian Institute of Chartered Accountants (CICA) had planned to adopt International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS), as published by the International Accounting Standards Board, effective January 1, 2011. Subsequently, the AcSB deferred the adoption of IFRS for investment companies, which include investment funds. Investment companies may continue to apply existing GAAP standards until fiscal years beginning on or after January 1, 2014.

The manager is reviewing and developing a plan to meet the above timetable for changeover to IFRS. The impact of IFRS on accounting policies and implementation decisions will mainly be in the areas of presentations and disclosures in the financial statements of the Fund. Currently, two significant areas that may impact the presentation are IAS 32 Financial Instruments: Presentation, and IAS 27 Consolidated and Separate Financial Statements. The manager is currently assessing the Fund's unitholder structure and investments to determine the impact of these standards. The manager has currently not identified any changes that will impact net asset value per unit (NAVPU) as a result of the changeover to IFRS. However, this present determination is subject to change resulting from the issuance of new standards or new interpretations of existing standards.

Related Party Transactions

Manager and Portfolio Adviser

The Fund is managed by Fidelity Investments Canada ULC (Fidelity). Fidelity is a wholly-owned subsidiary of FMR LLC. FMR LLC is the parent company of a group of subsidiaries collectively known as Fidelity Investments.

Fidelity provides or arranges for the provision of all general management and administrative services required by the Fund in its day-to-day operations, bookkeeping, record-keeping and other administrative services for the Fund.

Pyramis Global Advisors, LLC (Pyramis), an affiliate of Fidelity, provides investment advice to the Fund. Pyramis provides investment advice with respect to the Fund's investment portfolio and arranges for the acquisition and disposition of portfolio investments, including all necessary brokerage arrangements.

The Fund pays Fidelity and Pyramis a monthly management and advisory fee for their services, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. The Fund paid Fidelity and Pyramis management and advisory fees of \$20,000 for the period ended December 31, 2011.

Administration Fee

Fidelity charges the Fund a fixed administration fee in place of certain variable expenses. Fidelity, in turn, pays all of the operating expenses of the Fund, other than certain specified fund costs (e.g. the fees and expenses of the Independent Review Committee, taxes, brokerage commissions and interest charges). The Fund pays an annual rate, which is calculated on a tiered basis, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. The Fund paid Fidelity administration fees of \$3,000 for the period ended December 31, 2011.

Management and Advisory Fees

Fidelity serves as manager of the Fund and Pyramis serves as the investment advisor of the Fund. The Fund pays Fidelity and Pyramis a monthly management and advisory fee for their services, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. Fidelity uses these management fees to pay for sales and trailing commissions to registered dealers on the distribution of the Fund units, as well as for the general investment management and administrative expenses.
