Management Discussion of Fund Performance

Results of Operations

Units of this investment trust are only available for purchase by other Fidelity Pools and are not available for public purchase.

Fidelity U.S. Equity Investment Trust ("Fund"), Series O, returned -2.6% for the six-month period ended December 31, 2011. By way of comparison, the S&P 500 Index, broadly representative of the U.S. equity market, returned 1.6% over the same period (in Canadian dollar terms). The Fund's underperformance of the benchmark is primarily attributable to holdings in the financials, energy, telecommunication services and consumer staples sectors. At the end of the period under review, the Fund had exposures of 13.3% to financials, 12.2% to energy, 3.1% to telecommunication services and 11.4% to the consumer staples sector, which was in line with the benchmark weightings.

U.S. equities rose slightly during the period under review, in Canadian dollar terms. The European debt crisis and its implications for the global economic recovery had an impact on stock market returns. More recently, however, European leaders outlined steps to refinance peripheral debt and announced increased involvement by the IMF. Better-than-expected economic growth and corporate earnings calmed fears of a recession in the U.S. However, markets remained volatile amid growing uncertainty over the future of the euro, the ability of the U.S. to resolve its fiscal deficit situation and China's ability to withstand global economic headwinds.

Team leader John Power and the U.S. sector portfolio management team maintained a sector-neutral approach, keeping the sector exposures closely in line with those of the benchmark.

While the Fund is neutrally positioned at the sector level, the industry group allocations deviated from the benchmark. In the consumer discretionary sector, the Fund's exposure was shifted from the retailing and automobiles industries to select companies in the media industry that have strong fundamentals and are expected to perform well regardless of macroeconomic concerns. In the financials sector, exposure to diversified financial firms with large exposures to European debt was reduced, due to sovereign debt concerns. At the same time, exposure to the insurance industry was increased; these companies are relatively insulated from the debt crisis in Europe. In the consumer staples sector, exposure to companies in the food, beverage and tobacco industry and the household and personal products industry was increased, owing to strong fundamentals that make them relatively insensitive to economic cycles. In information technology, exposure to semiconductor-related stocks was increased, owing to attractive valuations.

Recent Developments

Portfolio manager John Power believes the near-term outlook will remain uncertain and global financial markets volatile until EU leaders agree on a policy to stem the sovereign debt crisis that the markets will view as credible. In addition, investors remain concerned about a slowdown in the global economy. In light of these macroeconomic concerns, Mr. Power believes that the market is being conservative about growth. However, corporate profits remain healthy, balance sheets have been repaired, and business momentum, though varied across sectors, remains positive. In addition, there are signs that China has avoided a hard economic landing, and there are encouraging indications that the U.S. labour and housing markets are both improving. Overall, Mr. Power is more optimistic about the prospects for the U.S. economy than the general consensus, and believes that the market is being conservative about growth. The Fund's sector weightings remain closely aligned with the ten Global Industry Classification Standard sectors of the S&P 500 Index, reflecting the team's intention to add return through stock selection, not through active sector allocation relative to the market. However, stock selection may drive positive or negative allocations, relative to the Index, at the sub-industry level.

As at December 31, 2011, the information technology sector accounted for the largest absolute exposure, followed by the financial sector. The household and personal products industry accounted for the largest overweight exposure, while the food, beverage and tobacco industry was the most underweighted.

On February 3, 2012, Fidelity announced that Young Chin will be assuming the role of lead portfolio manager, responsible for oversight of the Fidelity U.S. Equity Investment Trust, effective March 31, 2012. The Fund's sector portfolio managers, who are responsible for security selection and portfolio construction with their respective sector assignments, continue in their current roles.

Accounting Standards

Changeover to International Financial Reporting Standards

The Canadian Accounting Standards Board (AcSB) of the Canadian Institute of Chartered Accountants (CICA) had planned to adopt International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS), as published by the International Accounting Standards Board, effective January 1, 2011. Subsequently, the AcSB deferred the adoption of IFRS for investment companies, which include investment funds. Investment companies may continue to apply existing GAAP standards until fiscal years beginning on or after January 1, 2014.

The manager is reviewing and developing a plan to meet the above timetable for changeover to IFRS. The impact of IFRS on accounting policies and implementation decisions will mainly be in the areas of presentations and disclosures in the financial statements of the Fund. Currently, two significant areas that may impact the presentation are IAS 32 Financial Instruments: Presentation, and IAS 27 Consolidated and Separate Financial Statements. The manager is currently assessing the Fund's unitholder structure and investments to determine the impact of these standards. The manager has currently not identified any changes that will impact net asset value per unit (NAVPU) as a result of the changeover to IFRS. However, this present determination is subject to change resulting from the issuance of new standards or new interpretations of existing standards.

Related Party Transactions

Manager and Portfolio Advisor

The Fund is managed by Fidelity Investments Canada ULC (Fidelity). Fidelity is a wholly-owned subsidiary of FMR LLC. FMR LLC is the parent company of a group of subsidiaries collectively known as Fidelity Investments.

Fidelity provides or arranges for the provision of all general management and administrative services required by the Fund in its day-to-day operations, bookkeeping, record-keeping and other administrative services for the Fund.

Pyramis Global Advisors, LLC (Pyramis), an affiliate of Fidelity, provides investment advice to the Fund. Pyramis provides investment advice with respect to the Fund's investment portfolio and arranges for the acquisition and disposition of portfolio investments, including all necessary brokerage arrangements.

The Fund is only offered in Series O units and is not available for public purchase. The Fund was created as an underlying investment trust for the FCSC Private Pools. This Fund does not pay management and advisory fees.

Brokerage Commissions

The Fund may place a portion of its portfolio transactions with brokerage firms which are affiliates of Fidelity, including National Financial Services LLC, provided it determines that these affiliates' trade execution abilities and costs are comparable to those of non-affiliated, qualified brokerage firms, on an execution-only basis. Commissions paid to brokerage firms that are affiliates of Fidelity were \$0 for the period ended December 31, 2011. Fidelity receives standing instructions from the IRC in respect of policies and procedures governing best execution, which includes brokers affiliated to Fidelity, at least once per year.

The portfolio turnover rate is calculated based on the lesser of purchases or sales of securities divided by the weighted average market value of the portfolio securities, excluding short-term securities.
