Management Discussion of Fund Performance

Investment Objective and Strategies

Investment Objective: Fidelity Canadian Disciplined Equity® Class (Fund) aims to achieve long-term capital growth. It seeks a return similar to that of Fidelity Canadian Disciplined Equity® Fund (Underlying Fund), by investing substantially all of its assets in securities of the Underlying Fund. The Underlying Fund, which is also managed by Fidelity, aims to achieve long-term capital growth by investing primarily in equity securities of Canadian companies.

Strategies: The Underlying Fund aims to invest in the same sector weightings as the S&P/TSX Capped Composite Index, except that the real estate sector is considered an industry group within the financials sector. The Underlying Fund may invest in securities not included in the index. Members of a team of analysts are each assigned to a sector. The analysts each choose investments for their sector based on a thorough review of a number of factors, which may include each company's quality of management, financial condition, and potential for earnings growth over the long term. The Underlying Fund may invest in small, medium-sized and large companies. It may invest up to approximately 30% of its assets in foreign securities. It may also hold cash and invest in fixed-income securities.

Risk

The risks associated with investing in this Fund remain as discussed in the prospectus. Any changes to the Fund over the period have not affected the overall level of risk of the Fund.

The Fund is suitable for medium- to long-term investors who want to gain Canadian equity exposure, and can handle the volatility of returns generally associated with equity investments. Registered plan investors should be aware that the Fund may, from time to time, bear an income tax expense which will reduce returns. To invest in the Fund, investors should be willing to accept a medium level of risk. The suitability of the investment has not changed from what has been disclosed in the prospectus.

Results of Operations

Fidelity Canadian Disciplined Equity® Class, Series B, returned 27.3%, after fees and expenses, for the twelve-month period ended November 30, 2024. The net returns of the other series of the Fund are similar to those of Series B, except for differences attributable to expense structures. During the review period, Canadian equities, as represented by the S&P/TSX Composite Index, returned 30.7% (in Canadian dollar terms).

Market overview:

Canadian equities, as measured by the S&P/TSX Composite Index, returned 30.7% for the one-year period ended November 30, 2024.

Canadian equities rose over the review period, buoyed by strong performance in key sectors. Materials and financials were among the best performing sectors, driven by an increase in gold prices and a more favourable outlook on banking stocks amongst market participants, respectively. All sectors, except the communication services sector, advanced over the period. The telecommunications-heavy communication services sector declined due to stock specific factors. On the other hand, many companies in the information technology sector benefited from renewed investor optimism, and cyclical sectors such as industrials, consumer discretionary, and energy recorded solid gains despite periods of volatility. Market volatility persisted due to risks such as uncertainty around the direction of U.S. monetary policy and its resulting impact on the Canadian dollar and trade balance. The Canadian economy grew at a slower-than-expected pace, with an annualized growth rate of 1.0% in the third quarter of 2024 compared to higher growth earlier in the year. Inflation, as measured by the consumer price index, declined rapidly, from 3.1% in November 2023 to 2.0% in October 2024, indicating a slowdown in price increases. The labour market showed signs of softening, with the unemployment rate rising from 5.8% in November 2023 to 6.5% in October 2024. This trend supported the case for continued interest rate reductions by the Bank of Canada (BoC). Against this backdrop, the BoC announced a number of interest rate cuts, reducing the benchmark rate from 5.0% in November 2023 to 3.75% in October 2024.

Factors affecting performance:

The Fund's benchmark, the S&P/TSX Capped Composite Index, returned 30.7% for the review period. The Fund underperformed its benchmark, primarily due to the Underlying Fund's investments in certain stocks in the energy and financials sectors. In the energy sector, an investment in Canada-based oil and gas exploration and production firm Canadian Natural Resources and a lower-than-benchmark exposure to Canada-based pipeline and energy firm Enbridge detracted from relative returns. In the financials sector, a lack of exposure to a Canada-based financial services firm and a lower-than-benchmark exposure to Canada-based investment firm Brookfield Corporation, detracted from relative returns. In other sectors, investments in Canada-based telecommunications firm Rogers Communications and Canada-based automobiles and components firm Magna International detracted from relative returns. In contrast, investments in, and higher-than-benchmark exposure to, the materials sector contributed to relative returns. In the sector, an investment in Canada-based gold mining firm Agnico Eagle Mines and a lower-than-benchmark exposure to Canada-based fertilizer firm Nutrien, contributed to relative returns. In addition, exposure to certain stocks in the consumer staples sector contributed to relative returns. In other sectors, a lack of exposure to a Canada-based delecommunications firm, a lower-than-benchmark exposure to Canada-based integrated oil and gas firm Cenovus Energy, and an investment in Canada-based engineering firm AtkinsRéalis Group, contributed to relative returns.

At the end of the review period, the Underlying Fund had no exposure to Enbridge, Nutrien or Cenovus Energy.

Portfolio changes:

During the review period, portfolio manager Andrew Marchese and the investment team kept the Underlying Fund's sector weightings relatively close in line with those of the benchmark,

with security selection driving incremental returns. While the Underlying Fund is neutrally positioned at the sector level, it can deviate from the industry and company exposure of its hearthmark

During the review period, the investment team increased the Underlying Fund's exposure to the oil, gas and consumable fuels industry and capital markets industry. In the oil, gas and consumable fuels industry, the investment team initiated a position in Canada-based energy infrastructure firm TC Energy. In the capital markets industry, the investment team initiated a position in Canada-based alternative asset management firm Brookfield Asset Management. The investment team believed both stocks had an attractive risk/reward outlook. In contrast, exposure to the ground transportation industry and software industry decreased. In the ground transportation industry, the investment team exited a position in Canada-based transportation firm Canadian National Railway. In the software industry, the investment team exited a position in Canada-based software firm OpenText. These reductions were used to invest in other opportunities the investment team believes have better risk/reward potential.

At the end of the review period, the Underlying Fund had its largest absolute exposure to the oil, gas and consumable fuels industry, followed by the banking industry. The Underlying Fund diverged most from its benchmark's industry weightings by having more exposure to the financial services industry and less exposure to the banking industry.

Recent Developments

Portfolio manager Andrew Marchese believes that while markets have experienced heightened volatility, they remain focused on the long-term potential of high-quality companies. In the portfolio manager's view, as economic conditions stabilize, markets are likely to transition from being dominated by macroeconomic factors to being more driven by company-specific fundamentals. Against this backdrop, the portfolio manager and the investment team are focusing on companies they believe to have strong balance sheets. Macroeconomic analysis will continue to be reviewed against company fundamentals, with a focus on adding value by selecting companies the portfolio manager and the investment team believe exhibit attractive growth potential, strong management, and favourable risk/reward profiles.

Related Party Transactions

Manager and Portfolio Adviser

The Fund is managed by Fidelity Investments Canada ULC (Fidelity). Fidelity is part of a broader collection of companies collectively known as Fidelity Investments.

Fidelity provides or arranges for the provision of all general management and administrative services required by the Fund in its day—to—day operations, bookkeeping, record—keeping and other administrative services for the Fund.

Fidelity is the portfolio adviser to the Fund and it provides investment advisory services to the Fund. Fidelity provides investment advice with respect to the Fund's investment portfolio and arranges for the acquisition and disposition of portfolio investments, including all necessary brokerage arrangements. The Fund pays Fidelity a monthly management and advisory fee for their services, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. The Fund paid Fidelity management and advisory fees of \$1,985,000 for the period ended November 30, 2024.

Administration Fee

Fidelity charges the Fund a fixed administration fee in place of certain variable expenses. Fidelity, in turn, pays all of the operating expenses of the Fund, other than certain specified fund costs (e.g. the fees and expenses of the Independent Review Committee, taxes, brokerage commissions and interest charges). The Fund pays an annual rate, which is calculated on a tiered basis, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. The Fund paid Fidelity administration fees of \$213,000 for the period ended November 30, 2024.

Independent Review Committee, Cross-Trading and In specie Transactions

Independent Review Committee

Fidelity has established an independent review committee (IRC) that acts as an impartial and independent committee to review and provide recommendations or, if appropriate, approvals respecting conflict of interest matters referred to it by Fidelity. The IRC prepares, at least annually, a report of its activities for securityholders of the Fund. The report is available at www.fidelity.ca or at the securityholder's request at no cost by contacting Fidelity, using the contact information available on the final page of this document.

Cross-Trading and In specie Transactions

The Fund received the approval and standing instructions from the IRC in order to:

- (i) engage in cross-trading, which is a form of interfund trading. A cross-trade occurs when the Fund purchases or sells portfolio securities from or to another Fund, a U.S. fund or a separately managed account, through a broker;
- (ii) permit the Fund, in certain circumstances, to purchase and redeem Fund securities in consideration for securities rather than cash of another investment fund not governed by NI 81-102, or a separately managed account, managed by Fidelity.

For each of the transactions in (i) and (ii) above, the IRC's standing instructions require Fidelity to act in accordance with its associated policies and procedures and applicable law, and comply with the conditions in each of the exemptive relief orders received, which, in the case of cross-trading, requires additional periodic reporting to the Ontario Securities Commission. The standing instructions also require that investment decisions in respect of these transactions (a) are free from any influence by an entity related to Fidelity and without taking into account any consideration relevant to an entity related to Fidelity; (b) represent the business judgment of Fidelity uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interests of the Fund; (c) comply with the applicable policies and procedures of Fidelity; and (d) achieve a fair and reasonable result for the Fund.

The portfolio turnover rate is calculated based on the lesser of purchases or sales of securities divided by the weighted average market value of portfolio securities owned by the Fund, excluding short-term securities. The portfolio turnover rate includes any proceeds from a short sale in the value of sales of securities and the cost of covering a short sale in the value of purchases of securities. For periods greater than six months, but less than a full fiscal year, the portfolio turnover rate is annualized. The portfolio turnover rate excludes any adjustment for in-kind transactions.

Management and Advisory Fees

Fidelity serves as manager and investment advisor of the Fund. The Fund pays Fidelity a monthly management and advisory fee for its services, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. Fidelity uses these management fees to pay for sales and trailing commissions to registered dealers on the distribution of the Fund securities, as well as for the general investment management expenses. Dealer compensation represents cash commissions paid by Fidelity to registered dealers during the period and includes upfront deferred sales charge and trailing commissions. This amount may, in certain circumstances, exceed 100% of the fees earned by Fidelity during the period. For new Funds or Series the amounts presented may not be indicative of longer term operating periods.


