Management Discussion of Fund Performance

Investment Objective and Strategies

Investment Objective: Fidelity Advantage Bitcoin ETF® (Fund) aims to invest in bitcoin.

Strategies: In order to achieve its investment objective, the Fund invests primarily in bitcoin. The direct long-term holdings of bitcoin are purchased or received by the Fund only from acceptable bitcoin sources. An acceptable bitcoin source means a trading platform or venue or over-the-counter counterparty that (i) is registered or exempt from registration as a dealer or a marketplace in Canada or (ii) is regulated as a trust company or a broker-dealer under the laws of a state of the United States and, in each case, is required under such registration or by its regulator, as the case may be, to comply with applicable know-your-client requirements and AML regulation. Each acceptable bitcoin source is a spot market where bitcoin can be exchanged for U.S. or, in some cases, Canadian dollars. The portfolio management team conducts due diligence on each proposed acceptable bitcoin source in order to confirm its reputation and stability. This due diligence includes conducting research on the executive officers and significant shareholders and confirming that each acceptable bitcoin source maintains appropriate know-your-client policies and procedures and complies with AML regulation. In addition to receiving or purchasing bitcoin directly, the Fund may, from time to time, purchase or enter into derivatives that provide economic exposure to bitcoin, but any use of derivatives will be incidental to the Fund's primary investment strategy of investing directly in bitcoin. Currently, it is expected that the Fund will purchase only bitcoin futures. Any use of derivative instruments by the Fund must be in compliance with the requirements in NI 81-102 that apply to alternative mutual funds and any exemptive relief obtained by the Fund from the requirements of NI 81-102. The Fund will not use derivatives to leverage the investment portfolio of the Fund. The Fund does not speculate with regard to short-term changes in bitcoin prices. The Fund does not and will not hedge any U.S. dollar currency exposure back to the Canadian dollar. In addition, no currency hedging is entered into by the Fund in respect of the USD Units. Purchasing USD Units does not hedge - or protect - against losses caused by changes in the exchange rate between the Canadian and U.S. dollar. From time to time, the Fund may receive or hold surplus cash.

Risk

The risks associated with investing in this Fund remain as discussed in the prospectus. Any changes to the Fund over the period have not affected the overall level of risk of the Fund.

The Fund is suitable for long-term investors who want to look for a liquid alternative mutual fund strategy that provides exposure to bitcoin, and can handle the volatility of returns generally associated with bitcoin. The Fund is not an appropriate investment for investors with a short-term investment horizon. To invest in the Fund, investors should be willing to accept a high level of risk. The suitability of the investment has not changed from what has been disclosed in the prospectus.

Results of Operations

Fidelity Advantage Bitcoin ETF® (Fund) returned 23.1%, after fees and expenses, for the twelve-month period ended March 31, 2025. As a single-asset portfolio, the Fund's performance was driven solely by the performance of Bitcoin. Over the period under review, Bitcoin outperformed major stock and bond indexes.

Factors affecting performance:

As a single-asset fund, the Fund's performance was largely dependent on the performance of Bitcoin. Over the period under review, bitcoin soared to new heights in 2024, outperforming major stock and bond indexes, before retreating significantly in 2025.

The strong performance of Bitcoin in 2024 was primarily driven by the Securities Exchange Commission's approval of spot Bitcoin ETFs in the U.S., investors' preference for risky assets amid expectations of looser monetary policy and investors' hopes for greater levels of deregulation and transparency under a new U.S. administration. This combination of factors drove the cryptocurrency market to record levels.

Following the U.S. election, Bitcoin increased above US\$100,000 in the fourth quarter of 2024, rising more than 119% over the year. Performance was spurred by the new U.S. administration's pro-crypto messaging. Other key developments included the launch of Bitcoin ETF options that allowed investors to hedge various strategies and provided for innovation in structured products. This could increase demand for the underlying bitcoin asset, resulting in expanded institutional adoption by corporations and financial firms. Other technical metrics, such as mining, and subsequently the bitcoin hashrate, which is the total computing power used for mining, were all up in 2024, positively affecting the crypto ecosystem and the performance of the asset, though volume has dropped since its peak in November 2024 after the election.

The 2025 calendar year started with positive news for cryptocurrencies, and saw organizational changes at the SEC inspired by the new U.S. administration. Under the new leadership, investigations into U.S.-based crypto companies such as Coinbase and Uniswap were dropped, and the U.S. administration followed this with the announcement of a strategic Bitcoin reserve and digital asset stockpile, Crypto Summits at the White House and the development of the GENIUS Act, a bill focused on stablecoins legislation. These events created a positive atmosphere around cryptocurrencies, with Bitcoin being a major benefactor of the policy changes.

However, Bitcoin has still experienced significant volatility since the start of the year as markets in general reacted to the potential impact of tariffs, impending trade tensions and wider uncertainty, driving concerns about economic growth and inflation. Bitcoin closed the first quarter of 2025, down 11.6%, the second-largest quarterly decline since the second quarter of 2022. Tight monetary policies from central banks, reduced expectations of rate cuts by the U.S. Federal Reserve, heightened geopolitical tensions and widespread economic uncertainty have caused market participants to take a more cautious stance on risky assets such as cryptocurrencies and to flee to safer assets.

In addition to broad market issues, the cryptocurrency industry struggled with the effects of the Bybit exchange hack in February of 2025, which sparked security concerns and resulted in large withdrawals from users' wallets on the exchange and significant reductions in liquidity. Although the response from Bybit was quick and encouraging, the damage sent cryptocurrencies

prices down and stresses the need for improved security measures and some regulations regarding crypto companies.

Portfolio changes:

During the period, the Fund's position in Bitcoin was increased in line with share creations and trimmed in line with share redemptions.

Recent Developments

Portfolio managers Edward Lui and Reetu Kumra continue to invest in line with the strategy set out in the Fund's investment objective. The cryptocurrency market continues to evolve. Cryptocurrency ETFs continue to be launched globally; these ETFs naturally provide liquidity, which could stabilize Bitcoin price movements and provide greater depth to the market. Corporations are continuing to explore Bitcoin-related possibilities, which could broaden use into payment and transfer systems, supply chains and treasury management. The Bitcoin community continues to innovate through Layer 2 solutions (these are protocols built on top of the Bitcoin blockchain) that could address issues related to the network's scalability by processing transactions off the main network increasing throughput, block confirmation time and reduced transaction costs and enhance its usability by providing additional functionalities through the implementation of complex smart contract functionality. The end result is that greater capabilities and utilities for the network are discovered. As the technology continues to evolve, the infrastructure supporting it will likely continue to become more efficient and effective as relationships deepen between decentralized and traditional financial systems. Bitcoin market structure continues to improve as U.S. government policy advances; this could ultimately help broaden the investor base domestically and in other nations.

Effective February 11, 2025, Frances Horodelski retired from the Independent Review Committee (IRC), and James E. Cook of Etobicoke, Ontario, became a member of the IRC.

Related Party Transactions

Manager and Portfolio Adviser

The Fund is managed by Fidelity Investments Canada ULC (Fidelity). Fidelity is part of a broader collection of companies collectively known as Fidelity Investments.

Fidelity provides or arranges for the provision of all general management and administrative services required by the Fund in its day-to-day operations, bookkeeping, record-keeping and other administrative services for the Fund.

Fidelity is the portfolio adviser to the Fund and it provides investment advisory services to the Fund. Fidelity provides investment advice with respect to the Fund's investment portfolio and arranges for the acquisition and disposition of portfolio investments, including all necessary brokerage arrangements. The Fund pays Fidelity a monthly management and advisory fee for their services, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. The Fund paid Fidelity management and advisory fees of \$2,504,000 for the period ended March 31, 2025.

Brokerage Commissions

The Fund may place a portion of its portfolio transactions with brokerage firms which are affiliates of Fidelity, provided it determines that these affiliates' trade execution abilities and costs are comparable to those of non-affiliated, qualified brokerage firms, on an execution-only basis. Commissions paid to brokerage firms that are affiliates of Fidelity Investments were \$0 for the period ended March 31, 2025. Fidelity receives standing instructions from the IRC in respect of policies and procedures governing best execution of transactions with affiliates, which includes brokers affiliated to Fidelity Investments, at least once per year.

Independent Review Committee, Cross-Trading and In specie Transactions

Independent Review Committee

Fidelity has established an independent review committee (IRC) that acts as an impartial and independent committee to review and provide recommendations or, if appropriate, approves respecting conflict of interest matters referred to it by Fidelity. The IRC prepares, at least annually, a report of its activities for securityholders of the Fund. The report is available at www.fidelity.ca or at the securityholder's request at no cost by contacting Fidelity, using the contact information available on the final page of this document.

Cross-Trading and In specie Transactions

The Fund received the approval and standing instructions from the IRC in order to:

- (i) engage in cross-trading, which is a form of interfund trading. A cross-trade occurs when the Fund purchases or sells portfolio securities from or to another Fund, a U.S. fund or a separately managed account, through a broker;
- (ii) permit the Fund, in certain circumstances, to purchase and redeem Fund securities in consideration for securities rather than cash of another investment fund not governed by NI 81-102, or a separately managed account, managed by Fidelity.

For each of the transactions in (i) and (ii) above, the IRC's standing instructions require Fidelity to act in accordance with its associated policies and procedures and applicable law, and comply with the conditions in each of the exemptive relief orders received, which, in the case of cross-trading, requires additional periodic reporting to the Ontario Securities Commission. The standing instructions also require that investment decisions in respect of these transactions (a) are free from any influence by an entity related to Fidelity and without taking into account any consideration relevant to an entity related to Fidelity; (b) represent the business judgment of Fidelity uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interests of the Fund; (c) comply with the applicable policies and procedures of Fidelity; and (d) achieve a fair and reasonable result for the Fund.

^H The trading expense ratio represents total commissions, other portfolio transaction costs and dividends and interest expense on securities sold short expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value during the period, including the Fund's pro-rata share of estimated trading costs incurred in any underlying investment fund, if applicable.

^I The Fund's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the Fund's portfolio adviser manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the year. The higher the Fund's portfolio turnover rate in a year, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the year, and the greater chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high portfolio turnover rate and the performance of the Fund. The portfolio turnover rate is calculated based on the lesser of purchases or sales of securities divided by the weighted average market value of portfolio securities owned by the Fund, excluding short-term securities. The portfolio turnover rate includes any proceeds from a short sale in the value of sales of securities and the cost of covering a short sale in the value of purchases of securities. For periods greater than six months, but less than a full fiscal year, the portfolio turnover rate is annualized. The portfolio turnover rate excludes any adjustment for in-kind transactions.

Management and Advisory Fees

Fidelity serves as manager and investment advisor of the Fund. The Fund pays Fidelity a monthly management and advisory fee for its services, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. Fidelity uses these management fees to pay for sales and trailing commissions to registered dealers on the distribution of the Fund securities, as well as for the general investment management expenses. Dealer compensation represents cash commissions paid by Fidelity to registered dealers during the period and includes upfront deferred sales charge and trailing commissions. This amount may, in certain circumstances, exceed 100% of the fees earned by Fidelity during the period. For new Funds or Series the amounts presented may not be indicative of longer term operating periods.



The Fidelity Bitcoin Index is an index designed to reflect the performance of bitcoin in U.S. dollars. It uses bitcoin price data from eligible trading platforms and a volume weighted median price method based on the 5-minute window immediately prior to the 4:00 p.m. (ET) close. The Fidelity Bitcoin Index price is calculated by ordering all individual transactions occurring over this 5-minute time frame on the eligible trading platforms and selecting the price associated with the 50th percentile of total volume. The Fidelity Index Committee reviews the Fidelity Bitcoin Index semiannually for possible updates as a result of the maturation of the digital assets industry. In addition, the Fidelity Index Committee and the Fidelity Digital Asset Services Advisory Committee evaluate semi-annually all U.S. digital asset trading platforms and/or regulated digital asset trading platforms and may change the eligible trading platforms at that time or during market disruptions when a trading platform review is warranted. Each eligible trading platform used in the calculation of the Fidelity Bitcoin Index maintains appropriate know-your-client policies and procedures and complies with AML Regulation. Unitholders should know that other types of risks, both measurable and non-measurable, exist. Also, just as historical performance may not be indicative of future returns, historical volatility may not be indicative of future volatility. The risk rating of the Fidelity ETF set out above is reviewed annually and any time that it is no longer reasonable in the circumstances.
