Management Discussion of Fund Performance

Investment Objective and Strategies

Investment Objective: Fidelity Small Cap America Currency Neutral Class (Fund) aims to achieve long-term capital growth. It seeks a return similar to that of Fidelity Small Cap America Fund (Underlying Fund), by investing primarily in securities of the Underlying Fund. The Underlying Fund, which is also managed by Fidelity, aims to achieve long-term capital growth by investing primarily in equity securities of U.S. small-capitalization companies The Fund also uses derivatives to try to minimize the exposure to currency fluctuations between the U.S. and Canadian dollars.

Strategies: When buying and selling securities for the Underlying Fund, the portfolio manager examines each company's potential for success in light of its current financial condition, industry position, growth potential, earnings estimates, quality of management, as well as economic and market conditions. The Underlying Fund may invest in medium and large companies, and in securities of companies outside of the U.S. It may hold cash and invest in fixed-income securities.

Risk

The risks associated with investing in this Fund remain as discussed in the prospectus. Any changes to the Fund over the period have not affected the overall level of risk of the Fund.

The Fund is suitable for long-term investors who want to gain exposure to small U.S. companies while seeking to lower their risk of currency fluctuations between the U.S. and Canadian dollars, and can handle the volatility of returns generally associated with equity investments. Registered plan investors should be aware that the Fund may, from time to time, bear an income tax expense which will reduce returns. To invest in the Fund, investors should be willing to accept a medium to high level of risk. The suitability of the investment has not changed from what has been disclosed in the prospectus.

Results of Operations

Fidelity Small Cap America Currency Neutral Class, Series B, returned 14.0%, after fees and expenses, for the twelve-month period ended November 30, 2024. The net returns of the other series of the Fund are similar to those of Series B, except for differences attributable to expense structures. During the review period, U.S. equities, as represented by the S&P 500 Index - Hedged CAD, returned 32.6% (in Canadian dollar terms).

Market overview:

U.S. equities, as measured by the S&P 500 Index, returned 38.3% in Canadian dollar terms and 33.9% in U.S. dollar terms for the one-year period ended November 30, 2024.

U.S. equities rose over the review period as expectations of easier monetary policy and continued corporate earnings growth supported investor sentiment. The information technology and communication services sectors delivered strong performance, as advances in artificial intelligence supported investor optimism about earnings growth and the outlook for broad-based productivity gains for the U.S. and the global economy. In addition, companies within the financials sector advanced on signs of a more favourable interest rate environment along with a resilient economic backdrop. Other cyclical sectors, such as industrials and consumer discretionary also delivered positive returns. Towards the end of the review period, there was a shift in sector performance as investors turned to the utilities sector in search of income, while concerns about stretched valuations in the information technology and communication services sectors led to corrections in some of the largest Al-linked companies. The U.S. economy exhibited healthy growth, expanding by 2.8% in the third quarter, supported by robust consumer and government spending. However, geopolitical risks, mixed economic signals in the U.S., and the U.S. Federal Reserve's (the Fed) adoption of a more cautious approach to its monetary policy easing cycle introduced some volatility. Over the period under review, the Fed reduced its benchmark rate of interest twice in subsequent meetings (the Fed Funds Rate) from 5.5% to 5.0% in the September meeting and from 5.0% to 4.75% in the November meeting. U.S. inflation, as measured by the consumer price index, fell to 2.6% in October 2024 from 3.4% in December 2023.

Factors affecting performance:

The Fund underperformed its broad-based benchmark, the S&P 500 Index - Hedged CAD. The Underlying Fund's investments in, and higher-than-benchmark exposure to the consumer staples sector and investments in the consumer discretionary sector detracted from relative returns.

The Fund's benchmark, the Russell 2000 Index - Hedged CAD, returned 35.0% during the review period. The Fund underperformed its benchmark primarily due to the Underlying Fund's investments in the consumer staples sector, where out-of-benchmark exposure to U.S.-based beauty company Coty, and to Canada-based consumer staples distribution & retail firm Alimentation Couche-Tard, detracted from relative returns. Investments in the health care sector particularly, investments in Israel-based medical treatment solutions firm InMode, and out-of-benchmark exposure to U.S.-based holding company Chemed Corporation, also detracted from relative returns. In other sectors, investments in U.S.-based HR solutions firm Insperity, and U.S.-based automobiles and components firm Fox Factory Holding Corporation, detracted from relative returns.

In contrast, a lack of exposure to the energy sector contributed to relative returns where, a lack of exposure to a U.S.-based oil and natural gas exploration and production firm, and a U.S.-based oil and gas drilling firm, contributed to relative returns. A lack of exposure to the real estate sector particularly, a lack of exposure to a U.S.-based real estate investment trusts (REITs) firms, contributed to relative returns. In other sectors, investments in U.S.-based aftermarket parts and services firm VSE Corporation, U.S.-based consulting firm CRA International, and U.S.-based nuclear measurement and detection systems firm Mirion Technologies, all contributed to relative returns.

At the end of the review period, the Underlying Fund had no exposure to CRA International.

Portfolio changes:

During the review period, the Underlying Fund's exposure to the financials and utilities sectors was increased. In the financials sector, the portfolio manager initiated a position in U.S.-based insurance firm Reinsurance Group of America. In the utilities sector, a position was initiated in U.S.-based utilities firm NiSource.

In contrast, exposure to the health care and industrials sectors was decreased. In the health care sector, the portfolio manager exited a position in U.S.-based biomedical firm Charles River Laboratories. In the industrials sector, exposure was reduced to U.S.-based consulting firm FTI Consulting.

At the end of the review period, the Underlying Fund had its largest absolute exposure to the industrials sector, followed by the financials sector. The Underlying Fund diverged most from its benchmark's sector weightings by having more exposure to the consumer discretionary sector and less exposure to the health care sector.

Derivatives disclosure:

During the period, the Fund engaged in forward foreign currency contracts, in a manner consistent with its investment objectives and strategies, to hedge against the effect of currency fluctuations on the investment returns of the Fund. The use of forward contracts in this manner does not completely eliminate the impact of currency fluctuations on returns and the Fund's returns will differ from the local currency returns of the Underlying Fund's investments.

Recent Developments

Portfolio manager Steve MacMillan remains committed to an investment process which is focused on holding companies believed to have sustainable, lower-volatility business models, and generally holding them for the long term. The portfolio manager's goal continues to seek reduction in the overall volatility of the Fund while optimizing the portfolio's risk-return profile and still allowing investors to maintain exposure to the return potential of investing in equities. The manager believes to maintain a disciplined risk profile by emphasizing downside protection, with the goal of protecting investor capital. The portfolio manager believes an investment in small-capitalization U.S. equities is generally not a short-term trade, but rather a long-term strategic allocation with a place in any diversified portfolio. The manager continues to believe that small-cap companies are trading at relatively extreme valuations compared with their historical averages and is opportunistically looking for quality companies that they believe can drive sustainable earnings results.

Related Party Transactions

Manager and Portfolio Adviser

The Fund is managed by Fidelity Investments Canada ULC (Fidelity). Fidelity is part of a broader collection of companies collectively known as Fidelity Investments.

Fidelity provides or arranges for the provision of all general management and administrative services required by the Fund in its day—to—day operations, bookkeeping, record—keeping and other administrative services for the Fund.

Fidelity is the portfolio adviser to the Fund and it provides investment advisory services to the Fund. Fidelity provides investment advice with respect to the Fund's investment portfolio and arranges for the acquisition and disposition of portfolio investments, including all necessary brokerage arrangements. The Fund pays Fidelity a monthly management and advisory fee for their services, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. The Fund paid Fidelity management and advisory fees of \$970,000 for the period ended November 30, 2024.

Administration Fee

Fidelity charges the Fund a fixed administration fee in place of certain variable expenses. Fidelity, in turn, pays all of the operating expenses of the Fund, other than certain specified fund costs (e.g. the fees and expenses of the Independent Review Committee, taxes, brokerage commissions and interest charges). The Fund pays an annual rate, which is calculated on a tiered basis, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. The Fund paid Fidelity administration fees of \$158,000 for the period ended November 30, 2024.

Independent Review Committee, Cross-Trading and In specie Transactions

Independent Review Committee

Fidelity has established an independent review committee (IRC) that acts as an impartial and independent committee to review and provide recommendations or, if appropriate, approvals respecting conflict of interest matters referred to it by Fidelity. The IRC prepares, at least annually, a report of its activities for securityholders of the Fund. The report is available at www.fidelity.ca or at the securityholder's request at no cost by contacting Fidelity, using the contact information available on the final page of this document.

Cross-Trading and In specie Transactions

The Fund received the approval and standing instructions from the IRC in order to:

- (i) engage in cross-trading, which is a form of interfund trading. A cross-trade occurs when the Fund purchases or sells portfolio securities from or to another Fund, a U.S. fund or a separately managed account, through a broker;
- (ii) permit the Fund, in certain circumstances, to purchase and redeem Fund securities in consideration for securities rather than cash of another investment fund not governed by NI 81-102, or a separately managed account, managed by Fidelity.

For each of the transactions in (i) and (ii) above, the IRC's standing instructions require Fidelity to act in accordance with its associated policies and procedures and applicable law, and comply with the conditions in each of the exemptive relief orders received, which, in the case of cross-trading, requires additional periodic reporting to the Ontario Securities Commission. The standing instructions also require that investment decisions in respect of these transactions (a) are free from any influence by an entity related to Fidelity; and without taking into account any consideration relevant to an entity related to Fidelity; (b) represent the business judgment of Fidelity uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interests of the Fund; (c) comply with the applicable policies and procedures of Fidelity; and (d) achieve a fair and reasonable result for the Fund.

The higher the Fund's portfolio turnover rate in a year, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the year, and the greater chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high portfolio turnover rate and the performance of the Fund. The portfolio turnover rate is calculated based on the lesser of purchases or sales of securities divided by the weighted average market value of portfolio securities owned by the Fund, excluding short-term securities. The portfolio turnover rate includes any proceeds from a short sale in the value of sales of securities and the cost of covering a short sale in the value of purchases of securities. For periods greater than six months, but less than a full fiscal year, the portfolio turnover rate is annualized. The portfolio turnover rate excludes any adjustment for in-kind transactions.

Management and Advisory Fees

Fidelity serves as manager and investment advisor of the Fund. The Fund pays Fidelity a monthly management and advisory fee for its services, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. Fidelity uses these management fees to pay for sales and trailing commissions to registered dealers on the distribution of the Fund securities, as well as for the general investment management expenses. Dealer compensation represents cash commissions paid by Fidelity to registered dealers during the period and includes upfront deferred sales charge and trailing commissions. This amount may, in certain circumstances, exceed 100% of the fees earned by Fidelity during the period. For new Funds or Series the amounts presented may not be indicative of longer term operating periods.


